COLORADO/NEW MEXICO COMMUTER HERD AGREEMENT

This permit must be renewed in writing on a yearly basis; the State Veterinarian's Office at the Colorado Department of Agriculture (CDA) must receive applications at least two weeks prior to movement.

All trichomoniasis test results MUST accompany your application.

- Per New Mexico's import requirements, "A single negative PCR test for bovine Trichomoniasis ("Trich") for all beef bulls ≥ 12 months of age within 60 days prior to entry into New Mexico" will be required for all bulls being commuted with your herd.
 - If you will not be commuting bulls, the most recent trich test from your normal breeding cycle will be sufficient for approval.
 - If you have purchased cattle from another producer please include those test results.

Your application will be returned if all test information is not furnished or if testing dates are not within the acceptable guidelines.

The attached Commuter Herd Agreement, when completed and signed by the owner and the State Animal Health Officials of Colorado and New Mexico, will allow for the movement of your herd and their offspring. Commuter permits are for bonafide breeding herds only – <u>NO TRADER CATTLE.</u>
